Double Murder Suicide Investigation

Vallejo, Calif. - On Tuesday, April 21, 2020, shortly after midnight, three people were found dead inside a home in Vallejo from what appears to be a domestic violence double-murder suicide.

Based on the preliminary investigation, Vallejo Police detectives believe that suspect Raymond Thomas Jackson, a 50-year old Vallejo resident, shot his domestic partner with a shot-gun and then shot and killed her 14-year old daughter before turning the weapon on himself.

A 12-year old girl found her 53-year old mother and her 14-year old sister in the living room suffering from apparent gunshot wounds. After contact with the suspect, the 12-year old girl escaped by fleeing the residence, calling 911, and running to a neighbor's house for help.

Upon arrival by the police, the 12-year girl told officers that suspect Jackson shot her mother and sister. A short time later, officers confirmed three unresponsive subjects were inside the home. After police officers rendered the interior safe, paramedics pronounced the victims and suspect deceased at the scene.

Raymond Jackson has multiple convictions that include drug sales, assault with a deadly weapon on a police officer, and driving under the influence and was arrested for misdemeanor domestic violence on March 8, 2020, in the City of Vallejo. He was prohibited from possessing a firearm.

This incident is an ongoing investigation. The Solano County Coroner's office will release the identities of the victims after next of kin have been notified.
